

#### **AWARDS & RECOGNITION**

#### • 2016 Asclepius Awards

The awards provided the opportunity to recognize the accomplishments attained by our physicians who give themselves for the betterment of others in our hospital and the community.

#### • French Language Designation

The North Bay Regional Health Centre's request for partial designation as a French-language service provider has been granted under the French Language Services Act.

#### Patient Safety Award

In June staff from the North Bay Regional Health Centre (NBRHC) celebrated being the recipient of this year's MOREOB (Managing Obstetrics Risk Efficiently) Patient Safety Award for Ontario.

#### PhotoVOICE

NBRHC patients, staff and the community celebrated and recognized the completion of the final photoVOICE principle Strength-based with a gallery and showcase in the NBRHC gymnasium.

#### • Virtual Critical Care Unit

The Critical Care Unit at NBRHC is one of 23 hospitals across northeastern Ontario that has joined the Virtual Critical Care [VCC] Unit, based at Health Sciences North in Sudbury.

#### 2016-17 YEAR IN REVIEW

#### May 2016: Mammothon

The Health Centre's Ontario Breast Screening Program (OBSP) screened 98 women in a day for Mammothon.

#### May 2016: Virtual Critical Care award

The Critical Care Unit at NBRHC along with 23 hospitals across northeastern Ontario receives the VCC (Virtual Critical Care) award. Under the VCC model of care a team of intensive care physicians, specially trained nurses and intensive care unit respiratory therapists based at Health Sciences North are available for around the clock consultations and follow up visits for critically ill patients.

#### May 2016: Healthy Living Clinic Wraps Up 14th Year

The Healthy Living Clinic wrapped its 14th year in May with a celebration of patient achievements. The majority of the patients succeeded in losing an average of 5% of their body weight and increased their muscle and bone mass during the 16 week program. Patients participated in either three days a week of aquafitness or team sports and weight training with weekly educational sessions and metabolic monitoring.

#### June 2016: 2016 Physician Recognition Event & Asclepius Awards

North Bay Regional Health Centre celebrated with our 10th annual Physician Recognition Event and our 4th annual Asclepius Awards on Thursday June 2nd. Attendance at this event included an estimated 190 guests, and provided the opportunity to recognize our physicians for all of the outstanding work they do with our hospital and community.

#### June 2016: NBRHC is the recipient of MORE OB Patient Safety Award for Ontario

In June staff from the North Bay Regional Health Centre celebrated being the recipient of this year's MOREOB (Managing Obstetrics Risk Efficiently) Patient Safety Award for Ontario. This prestigious award is given to teams who have demonstrated exceptional commitment to improving patient safety within their obstetrical unit, and has only been presented to four maternal teams this year in North America.

#### June 2016: Healthcare Leadership Volunteer Program

Five volunteers from the Healthcare Leadership Volunteer Program presented their findings to managers, physicians and senior leaders at the North Bay Regional Health Centre following their eight-week program.

#### • July 2016: Strategic Planning Started

The NBRHC embarked on a new strategic planning exercise. The goal of the exercise was to deliver a strategic plan that would guide the Health Centre for the next three years—2017-2019. The 2017-2019 strategic planning exercise was led by Board of Directors representatives and supported by a broad group of internal representatives — senior leadership, administration and frontline staff.

#### <u>August 2016: NBRHC Hosts North Bay's Newest Residents</u>

NBRHC hosted 13 students from the North Bay and District Multicultural Centre. The students were studying the topic of health and came to the Health Centre to learn more about its programs and services as part of the Multicultural Centre's summer English as Second Language (ESL) program.

#### <u>August 2016: Congratulations James – recipient of the Volunteer Involvement Award</u>

The NBRHC Volunteer Involvement Committee awarded the first ever Volunteer Involvement Award to James Bunker, a fourth-year student from Nipissing University in the Bachelor of Science Nursing program who volunteers in the Hospital Elder Life Program. This new award recognizes NBRHC volunteers who exemplify our values and make a positive impact in our Health Centre.

#### September 2016: 100% Notification Rate from the Trillium Gift of Life Network

NBRHC achieved a 100% notification rate from the Trillium Gift of Life Network – meaning the hospital reported all potential organ and tissue donation opportunities to Trillium.

#### October 2016: Indigenous Blessing and Teaching Ceremony

Patients, families, staff and community partners attended a blessing and teaching in the outdoor Indigenous Ceremonial Area led by respected Nipissing First Nation Elder, Peter Beaucage. The cultural celebration was an opportunity to share in Indigenous culture and develop a deeper appreciation and respect for the Indigenous ceremonial space at the Health Centre.

#### October 2016: The 10th Annual Our Hospital Walk/Run

NBRHC's Walk/Run marked its 10 year anniversary and reached an important milestone – more than \$1 million in total funds raised for your hospital.

#### • November 2016: Smilezone Transforms Patient Areas at NBRHC & One Kids Place

The Smilezone Foundation transformed the space in NBRHC's Child and Adolescent Mental Health Unit to create more vibrant areas through paint, murals, iPad station, inspiring wall graphics and a tactile station.

#### January 2017: 2017-19 Strategic Plan Launched

NBRHC's Board of Directors officially launched the 2017-2019 Strategic Plan. Developed for our patients and with our patients, this plan will act as a road map for the next three years--every direction, concept and objective will put the PATIENT FIRST. 1550 members of our communities provided input into this plan, and we learned what is most important to those we serve — safety, wellness, technology, community engagement, cultural competency, access and collaboration.

#### January 2017: Pediatric Virtual Critical Care Program Goes Live

Expanding on the award winning Virtual Critical Care Program for adults in partnership with CHEO and the NE LHIN.

#### January 2017: Quality Improvement Review

A quality improvement review of the central referral for tertiary mental health services resulted in 45% reduction in wait times from referral to admission. There was also a significant improvement to patient flow, access to care and communication with patients/partners as a result.

#### March 2017: Cancer Care Ontario Turnaround Times

98.6 % of cancer resection reports of all disease sites received by Cancer Care Ontario within 14 calendar days from date of surgery — NBRHC is exceeding the provincial average of 83.2%.

#### March 2017: Patient Ombudsman Visits NBRHC

NBRHC welcomed Ontario's Patient Ombudsman, Christine Elliott during her cross-province tour. She was here to learn more about patient-centred initiatives taking place at the Health Centre and to educate us about the role of the Ombudsman in the patient complaint process.

### Message from the Foundation CEO & Board Chair

In the 2016/2017 fiscal year we began creating a new vision for an opportunity that allows our community to have an impact on health care close to home.

We are grateful to our more than 100 Foundation volunteers, along with our patients and families who inspire our community through sharing their personal and compelling experiences of healing, recovery and sometimes loss.

This year, the Foundation provided more than \$11.5 million to the Health Centre. Municipal support accounted for \$9.6 million, the majority coming from the City of North Bay completing its commitment to the building fund for the new hospital. Your personal generosity helped the Foundation provide \$1.7 million for urgently needed medical equipment and programs. In addition, \$115,000 in gifts-in-kind were secured that have a direct impact on patient experiences.

The success of your communities' fundraising effort is having a significant impact:

- The GreenLight Laser for our fathers, husbands, brothers and sons has now been fully funded through your community support. Thank you.
- By funding a substantial cost of establishing a healing environment for the Child and Adolescent Mental Health Unit (CAMHU), your community has ensured children have access to the mental health care they need, close to home. Thank you.
- Because of your support, the hospital is taking steps toward implementing components of the Central Fetal Monitoring System for labour and delivery. Thank you.
