- Current Certificate of Registration ~ College of Nurses of Ontario required
- Current Basic Life Support (BLS) for Health Care Providers (HCP) Certificate required (within the last twelve months)
- Current Non-Violent Crisis Intervention (NVCI) Certificate required (training delivered by Health Centre upon hire)
- Recent acute medical experience in an active care setting (within 2-3 years) required
- Relevant experience in caring for TIA/Stroke patients an asset
- Telemetry monitoring and knowledge of cardiac rhythms an asset
- Current certificate in I.V. Therapy required
- Clinical experience in Rehabilitation Care required
- Relevant nursing skills such as wound management, sponge vac management, central lines and CADD pumps, TPN (total parenteral nutrition), enteral feed and tracheostomy are required
- Stroke Nursing Certification required or successful completion within 60 days of hire required
- Semi-Automatic Defibrillation required or willing to certify
